COVID-19 Protection Regulation



The Saxon state government lifted the COVID-19 Protection Regulation on 1 March 2023.

Since 3 February 2023, **there have been no state-specific COVID-19 protective measures in Saxony.**

As of 1 March 2023, the mandatory testing requirements under the Infectious Disease Protection Act will cease at hospitals, care facilities and integration support facilities.

An overview of the COVID-19 measures

Facility-based mask mandate

The wearing of FFP2 masks or equivalent respirator masks is mandatory for

visitors entering the following facilities:

- Hospitals (including the associated forensic psychiatric hospitals) and rehabilitation facilities providing hospital-grade medical care,
- In-patient and semi-residential care facilities where older people, people with disabilities or people requiring care are looked after and housed, or equivalent facilities,



Patients and visitors of:

- Medical clinics, dental practices, psychotherapy practices,
- The practices of other allied health professions (e.g. physiotherapists, occupational therapists),
- Day-surgery facilities,
- Dialysis facilities,
- Day hospitals,
- Treatment or care facilities equivalent to any of the facilities listed above,
- Public-health facilities conducting/providing medical examinations, preventive checks or outpatient treatment,
- Rescue services

Facility-based mandatory testing

Mandatory testing was lifted on 1 March 2023.
