

# INFORMATION FOR PEOPLE ARRIVING IN SAXONY

## The following applies:

Anyone entering Germany from abroad can take a free coronavirus test within 72 hours. Anyone entering the country from a risk area has been obliged to take a corona test since 8 August.

The provisions of the Saxon Corona Quarantine Ordinance always apply irrespective of the instructions issued by the Federal Ministry of Health.

## Mandatory test for people returning from risk areas:

Any travellers returning from abroad must be quarantined if they enter the country from somewhere that is classified as a risk area on the day of arrival.

## What do I have to do if I enter Saxony from a risk area?

You will be obliged to take a coronavirus test, provide information and contact the local public health office. You must submit a negative test result – at the latest when requested by the public health office.

You must self-isolate at home until you have submitted a negative test result. A traveller may be placed under the surveillance of the public health office for up to 14 days after arrival.

## What information will I have to provide?

If you arrive by plane, train, ship or bus, the following information will be collected by the transport company via a passenger locator form and forwarded to the local public health office:

If you arrive by car, motorcycle etc., you must report this information to the public health office yourself at your place of residence/stay. This obligation does not apply to employees like aircraft crew or lorry drivers, nor does it apply to transit passengers who are not going to stay in the Free State of Saxony.

## Do I have to get tested if I enter from a risk area?

Yes. You have the following options (free within 72 hours of arrival):

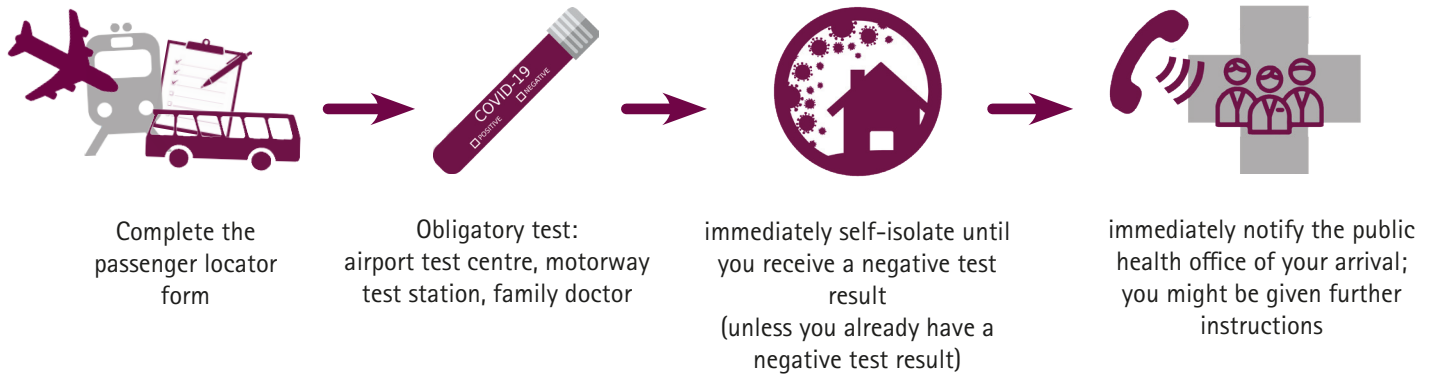


Overview of risk areas

## What applies to people returning by plane, train or bus?

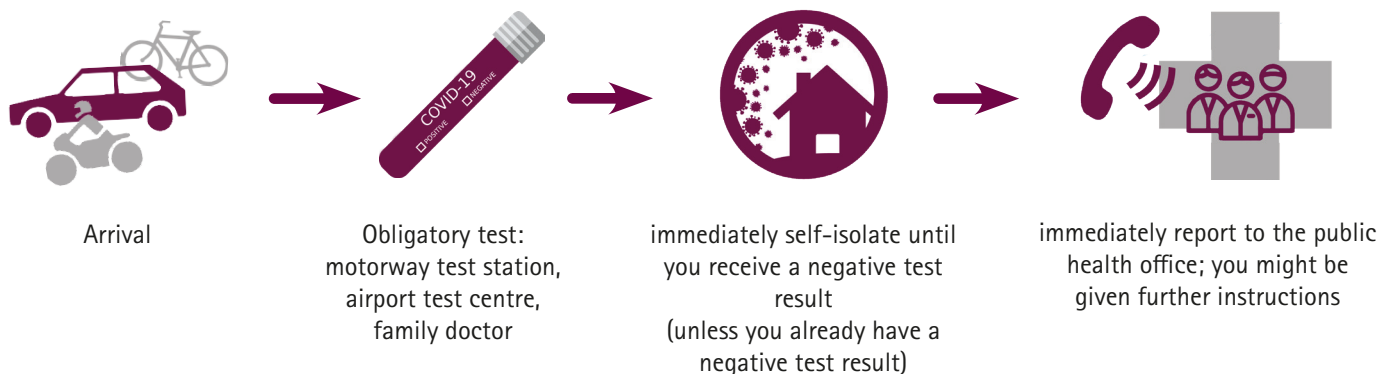
Anyone returning from a risk area will be obliged to take a coronavirus test, provide information and contact the local public health office.

The data will be collected by the transportation company via a passenger locator form and forwarded to the local public health office.



## What applies to people returning by car, motorcycle, bicycle, etc.?

Anyone returning from a risk area will be obliged to take a coronavirus test, provide information and contact the local public health office.



## Voluntary test for people returning from non-risk areas:

You will not be obliged to take a coronavirus test or provide information. However, you can take a free voluntary test at the airport test centres in Leipzig/Halle and Dresden and at the motorway test stations (A17: Heidenholz car park, A4: An der Neiße car park). You can also get tested by your family doctor up to 72 hours after arrival. You must provide plausible evidence to prove you have been travelling.
